Opening by the Chair

- The Chair of the DMAG opens the meeting.
- It was a good year. We have now all 28 countries with RDP. Thanks to Erwin Koeken for setting up the new logo as well as a banner featuring all 28 members.
- The new logo includes our newest member, Estonia.
- As of January 1st, 2025, we will represent all RDP MOU countries.

Report from the Executive Committee

The trip to Arizona and AZDIC has been postponed due to FVR and timeline considerations. The new dates are April 28 through May 2, 2025. Individuals outside the embassies who are interested, such as colleagues responsible for offset, are also welcome to participate.

The new award will be called the Annual Award for Outstanding Achievement in International Defense Industrial Cooperation (AAOAIDIC). This year, it will be awarded to FCT lead by COL Naff.

Report from the Working Group on Industrial Base Cooperation (IBCWG)

Chair IBCWG, Joakim Lewin (SWE):

- Continue MOU training at least one more time.
- Spoke with the Defense Acquisition University to see if they can assist us with MOU training.

Report from the Working Group on Export Controls (ECWG)

Chair ECWG, Martti Wallin (FIN):

- August-related amendments have been relaxed.
- Of course, some requirements have become more stringent.
- This refers to dual-use areas such as quantum computing items, advanced semiconductor manufacturing equipment, certain semiconductor technologies, and additive manufacturing items.
- Even countries have an expectation that they need to report anyway.
- It is directly related to the CMMC.
- The interesting element about these dual-use changes is that, in many cases, the deemed export part involves disclosing the information to a foreign national.
- Under the grandfather rule, people will remain employed and have access to the data.

Report from the Working Group on Cyber (CWG)

Chair CWG, LCDR Alain Gilbert (CAN):

- Due to the inauguration, there is currently a lack of updates regarding the CMMC.
- More information is expected by the end of February or the beginning of March.

Other Issues Affecting Members

In mid-January, CSIS will present the results of the DMAG survey: Treating Allies and Partners as Allies and Partners. The presentation will take place at the CSIS facility on January 15th, 2025. Every country is encouraged to attend, even if they did not participate in the survey.
