B.0 Overview of Estonian defense industry policy (1445 – 1515)

B. Speaker (1515 - 1600)

Stephen Tankel (Nonresident Senior Fellow, Transatlantic Security Initiative, Atlantic Council) is a nonresident senior fellow at the Transatlantic Security Initiative of the Atlantic Council's Scowcroft Center for Strategy and Security. He is a national security expert with twenty years of experience working across government, the uniformed military, academia, and nongovernmental organizations. He is currently an associate professor in the Department of US Foreign Policy and Global Security at American University.

Tankel recently served as the director of defense policy and strategy on the National Security Council staff, for which he was awarded the Defense Meritorious Service Medal. Stephen also served on two occasions in the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy at the Department of Defense, at the State Department, and on the House Foreign Affairs Committee majority staff. In addition to his government service, he is an intelligence officer in the US Navy Reserve.
